## From Pastor Randy... \* "Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find;

7 "Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. (Matt. 7:7 ESV)



Off and on in my life I have been good at finding things even though I was not seeking them. I have also been disappointed with not finding things even though I was seeking them. Have you had this problem too?

For example let's consider arrowheads. There have been many times, especially in my younger years, I purposely went in search of arrowheads. Most often when I was seeking, I was not finding them. There could be many reasons for this; my lack of concentration, working in an area that has been worked over many many times, worrying more about where I was going (looking up instead of down), or even that I didn't recognize them when I did see them. Yet I have found a few beauties in my time. Most of the few that I have are nice but won't win any prizes at the National Arrowhead Showoff and Swap Meet; if there is such a thing. Once I even found a perfect one honed from dark black flint. It's my pride and joy as far as arrowheads go. And maybe that is what kept my searches going; finding one once in a while can be quite the incentive to look some more.

Maybe the best thing to do is remember those times when you stumbled upon God. Didn't you want to share your find with others? And that's something you can have all the time if you seek.
